VEHICLE THEFT INFORMATION AND BEST PRACTICES

- O DO: * Invest in a good anti-theft device. * Bait for an automatic gate to close behind you. * Be mindful of any suspicious persons or activities near a vehicle, call the police immediately. * Park in open, visible areas. * Light your driveway at night. * Engrave your stereo and other on-board valuables with your Driver's License number. * When fueling your vehicle, ensure that you have your vehicle's key with you at all times and lock your vehicle if leaving.
- O DO NOT: * Leave property in your vehicle. * Leave personal identification. * Set the 'Home' function on your GPS device. * Keep your garage door opener in your vehicle. * Keep spare keys to your vehicle in the vehicle.

Useful tips on how 9-1-1 works in relation to the police

Non Emergency Reporting

- The police non-emergency number in Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows is 604-463-6251
- The non-emergency line is for situations where immediate response or dispatch of police is **NOT REQUIRED**
- Examples: Reporting crime with no suspect, reporting ongoing drug use, loud parties
- The call-taker has a bit more time to gather more information

What is a non-emergency call?

- No immediate Threat to life or property
- Less of a chance of an escalation (e.g. noisy party)
- Is after the fact Crime already happened (stolen vehicle), suspect no longer on scene

RCMP File Numbers

- Once a report is taken by a Report Agent, they will issue you a file number. Example: RM13-12345
 - o RM for Ridge Meadows
 - o 13 for the year 2013
 - o 12345 number of files created to date.

Emergency Calling 9-1-1

When to call 9-1-1

- Something "in progress" e.g. fights, break and enters (if suspects on scene), impaired driver report.
- Something that has "just occurred" e.g. serious crime such as sexual assault, robbery
- Something "about to occur" e.g. vandal, prowler
- Any threat to life and/or property e.g. screams, attacks, gunshots, fire, accident with injuries/medical

What to expect when you call 9-1-1:

- A call-taker will answer by saying: "9-1-1: do you need police, fire, or ambulance?"
- Tell the call-taker which service you require and for which City.
- You will then be transferred to the requested agency where they will answer with, for example, "Ridge-Meadows RCMP emergencies"

Event in progress or "just occurred"

- A call-taker will obtain the initial information
- They will pass on pertinent information to the dispatcher through the computer system
- The dispatcher will broadcast the event to all units (cars), or to a specific channel based on the type of call

Calling 9-1-1 using the 7 W's

- What is happening or just happened?
- Where is your location and the location the incident is occurring?
- When did it happen, has there been a time delay?
- What are you observing? a crime in progress or is it about to happen?
- Where did the suspect flee? On foot or in a vehicle?
- What kind of vehicle was involved? Description and plate # if known?
- Where is the suspect's direction of travel?

PLEASE NOTE: Insert Area code 604 before dialling each number, unless otherwise noted! In case of an EMERGENCY CALL 911

What is Anti-social Behaviour?

Any aggressive, intimidating or destructive activity that damages or destroys another person's quality of life.

Anti Social Behaviour definition is the behaviour by an individual or group that results in:

- another party feeling personally threatened
- creates a public nuisance, or
- has a detrimental impact upon the environment and thereby has a detrimental effect upon the quality of life of an individual or the community as a whole.

Street problems which can include...

- Begging & panhandling
- Noise

• Intimidation

Harassment

- Sex trade workers
- Dealing and buying drugs in public
- Loitering inside or outside your business
- Blocking or intercepting customers trying to enter your business

Environmental Anti-social behaviour includes:

Graffiti

Littering

Vandalism

How anti-social behaviour affects us: Anti social behaviour impacts negatively on all people, young and old, in all communities. It reduces the quality of life for all residents. Graffiti doesn't look good and has a huge impact on our communities, not to mention the costs of cleaning it up.

Why does Anti-Social Behaviour happen?

There are many factors that could cause the risk of anti-social behaviour happening.

What you can do?

Do not confront or say anything to a person demonstrating anti social behaviour. Any concerns, or other community safety issues, please do not hesitate to contact RM RCMP at 604-463-6251, or in case of an emergency call 911.

- 1. Make a list of possible improvements.
- 2. Contact our office (604-467-2420), when unsure if your improvements are eligible.... or if you have ANY questions about FIP or LOCTED Programs.
- 3. Contact a local contractor and obtain a couple of project quotes.
- 4. Complete the one page FIP or LOCTED Application.
- 5. Complete project by Dec. 31, 2024 deadline and submit invoices to receive approved grant amount.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Eligible commercial buildings must be located within the Downtown Maple Ridge Business Improvement Association (DMRBIA)
 Area.
- The applicant must be the property or business owner, with property owner's written consent.
- Grants are only paid upon completion of the pre-approved LOCTED project.; applications submitted after project is completed (or started) are not eligible.
- Maximum grant is 50% of cost of eligible improvements, maximum of \$2,000 per building.
- Only projects which meet eligible improvements, or are otherwise deemed eligible upon review by the LOCTED Committee
 may be eligible to receive a grant.

PROCEDURE

- All applicants are encouraged to directly connect with the DMRBIA prior to formally submitting their application to discuss the
 program process, review project intention, and outline eligible improvements.
- Personalized CPTED assessment for applicant property scheduled and recommendations proposed according to outcome.
- Completed application submitted to the DMRBIA.
- Project Review Committee reviews the application and will either approve, approve with conditions or refuse an application at its discretion. Additional information may be requested.
- A Performance Agreement is entered into between the successful applicant and the DMRBIA, which will include a description
 of the project, total cost of the project, list of eligible project expenses, start and completion dates of the project (completion
 must occur by December 31, 2024), amount of the grant awarded, and any conditions.
- Project can start immediately following written approval from DMRBIA
- Applicant provides to the DMRBIA a written notice of completion signed by the applicant or contractor, copies of all invoices
 pertaining to the project, proof of payment, and proof of final inspection (where required) + "after pictures".
- Completed project is inspected by the Project Review Committee.
- Applicant is issued a cheque (up to 50% of actual cost/excluding taxes, to maximum of \$2,000).

ELIGIBLE LOCTED IMPROVEMENTS

Environmental building features, eligible for LOCTED grant dollars, may include, but are not restricted to the following CPTED based upgrades. Improvements are intended to possibly influence behaviour and encourage stewardship, while reducing acts of vandalism; AND support CMR Bylaws' and RM RCMP's goal of helping reduce property crime. Eligible improvements include:

Wall attachments Exterior Security Lighting Environmental Engineered Details Design Fees
Door modifications Storefront clearance Remove Landscaping Details Fencing

Window access Add Landscaping Elements Obstructed Entranceways Ext. Alarm/part of project

GRANT APPROVAL

- All project proposals are subject to a comprehensive review, must meet high quality standards, and must reflect the spirit and intent of the LOCTED Program Guidelines.
- Submission of an application is not a guarantee of funding approval or a specific grant amount.

GRANT REIMBURSEMENT PROCESS

- The applicant must provide the following to the DMRBIA for reimbursement:
- A written notice of completion signed by the applicant or contractor;
- Copies of all invoices pertaining to the project and proof of payment (copies of credit card receipts or cancelled cheques);
- Proof that improvements have passed final inspection (where required) and meet all City of Maple Ridge requirements including zoning, building and safety code (where required);
- Project inspection completed by Project Review Committee;
- Applicant is issued a cheque.

IMPORTANT

- Full details of this program are contained in the LOCTED Guide.
- The Applicant must obtain all necessary development, building and sign permits and is encouraged to consider the additional time required to obtain such permits.
 - If the proposed improvements significantly alter the external building appearance (i.e. changes to existing materials, form & character) and/or if the work value is greater than \$25,000 the applicant may be required to submit a Development Permit Application to the CMR and will have to refer to the Maple Ridge Town Centre Development Permit Area Guidelines.



THE DOWNTOWN MAPLE RIDGE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION (DMRBIA)

The DMRBIA is implementing a new security add on service of a security camera placed at eye level in business storefronts.

The camera is meant to deter criminal activity before it happens as it is easy to spot and follows the subject as long as they are within a customized activity zone set by businesses themselves.

Please Note:

This is an addition to any current security in place and participation will not be allowed to replace existing or as the only form of security.

Upon approval of member application and payment for camera. (50% payment of camera by member \$32.50 - invoice will be sent when approved for program)

- DMRBIA will arrange an appointment time to supply and install 1 security camera in your business / storefront at eye level.
- At installation the BIA Member participant will be required to sign up to the camera app and cloud storage (approx. \$40/year).
- During set up, camera must be shared and access allowed to the DMRBIA.
 This is solely for the purpose of reporting to necessary organizations (Security, RCMP, Social services etc.).
- Participant will treat the camera as they would a security alarm system.
 Activating when not in place of business and de-activating when on site.

What you Need to Know

The Securing Small Business Rebate Program is ready to help small businesses with vandalism-related costs and to install measures to prevent future vandalism.

The streamlined application portal will be accepting applications until January 31, 2025 from businesses looking to offset the costs of repairing or preventing vandalism.

Types of Rebates Available

Reparative Rebate

- Provides immediate relief to offset expenses for damage to eligible commercial property due to crime and vandalism on or after January 1, 2023.
- Available as a one-time rebate of up to \$2,000, for each of 2023 and 2024.
- Retroactive to January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2024.
- Examples of eligible damage include:
 Broken windows, locks and doors, and graffiti.

Preventative Rebate

- Provides funding for eligible proactive/ preventative measures to mitigate vandalism damage against eligible commercial property.
- Available as a one-time rebate of up to \$1,000.
- Retroactive to January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2024.
- Examples of eligible measures include installation of: Shatterproof glass, locks, cameras, alarms, security lighting and gates.
